I am in receipt of your email dated January 17, 2017 in regards to the permit for the mainland dock project.

The email included an attached email dated January 17, 2017 from Mr. Chris Raffael of Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change(MOECC) that indicated MOECC had no concern with in water works commencing at the main land dock site. (copy of email attached).

On this basis, Loyalist Township has no objection to the contractor proceeding on the mainland dock location provided the terms expressed by Mr. Raffael are met in full, in particular that no construction work, staging or other activities related to dock construction are permitted on the parcel of land covered by the certificate of property (6676-9CWHB7-2S) until an amendment has been issued. When this amendment is granted Loyalist Township requires written clearance from the Ministry and a copy of the amended Certificate of Property

Loyalist Township requires that a minimum notice of 5 days be given prior to commencement of work.

I trust that this satisfies your concerns on this matter.

Sean, Ariel, Dan,

As the proposed in-water works on the mainland dock site are not taking place on the property identified by CPU No. 6676-9CWHB7-2S, the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change does not have any concerns with this work commencing. As previously stated, no construction work, staging or other activities related to the dock construction is permitted on the parcel of property covered by the CPU (6676-9CWHB7-2S) until an amendment to the CPU has been issued. To avoid any issues, it is suggested that all personnel involved in the in-water construction work are made aware and adhere to this requirement. Furthermore, as you have already mentioned, all of the requirements of the REA as well as any other licences or permits from other agencies would be required to be met.
