



**NOTICE TO USERS

BATH & FAIRFIELD WATER SYSTEMS  
  
PEAK WATER DEMAND MANAGEMENT PLAN**

Please be advised that peak water demand measures are being established for all residences and commercial establishments serviced by the Bath and Fairfield Water Treatment Plants.

In the summer months, peak daily water flows are substantially higher than base daily flows using valuable plant capacity. This capacity could be used to service new development and increase the number of users to share the costs. The goal of the demand management plan is to reduce the gap between the peak summer demand and the base summer demand.

In an effort to maximize the use of both the Bath and Fairfield water systems, effective July 1, 2006, Loyalist Township will implement a peak water demand management plan by restricting outdoor water use on even and odd numbered days, based on the civic address of the property. This will be an annual restriction in place for the months of May to September inclusive.

The limits on outdoor use of water include, but are not limited to, watering lawns and gardens, car washing, pool filling, sidewalks and driveway cleaning, but does not include using a handheld watering can for the occasional watering of plants and flowers. This mandatory limitation will be strictly enforced.

For special circumstances, such as watering new sod or seed planting, the Director of Engineering Services, upon receiving a written request, may grant a limited exemption to the by-law.

Fairfield water users: please note that construction activity currently at the Fairfield plant will, for a limited period of time this summer, require full outdoor watering restrictions. Over the next two months, watch for additional Township ads or visit the Township's web site for the actual dates for the total ban of outdoor water use. The full restriction is needed to allow for plant upgrades and to make sure there is sufficient water to protect public health and safety
