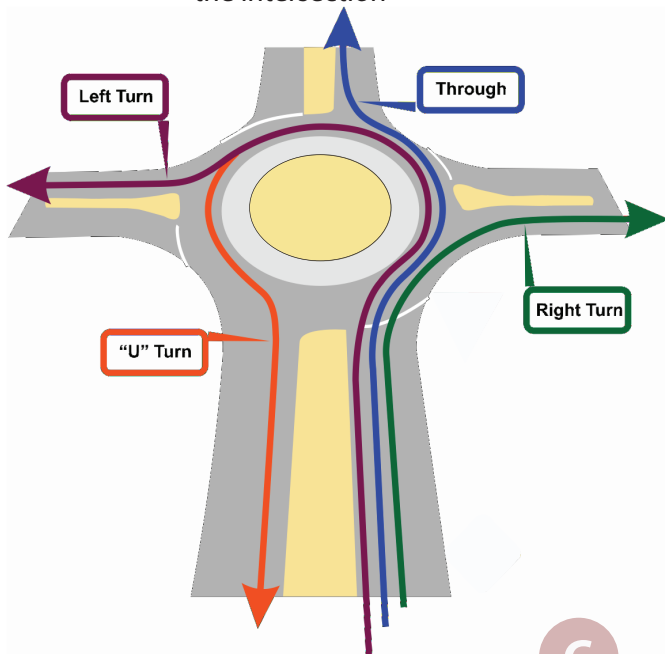


HOW TO DRIVE A ROUNDABOUT

Guidelines to Remember:

1. Slow Down
2. Yield to traffic in the circle
3. Obey one-way signs
4. Keep right when entering the intersection



A
A roundabout will have ONE WAY signs mounted in the center island. All vehicles travel counter clockwise around the island.

B
Left turns and U-turns are completed by traveling around the center island.

C
When entering a roundabout, always yield to traffic circulating in the roundabout. Wait for a safe gap in the traffic, remembering that those in the roundabout have the right-of-way.

D
Cyclists navigate a roundabout as if they were automobiles.

ROUNDBABOUTS HELP MOVE TRAFFIC SAFELY AND EFFICIENTLY

Roundabout vs Traffic Circle

- ◆ Roundabouts are much smaller than older traffic circles
- ◆ Roundabouts have Yield control on each leg of the intersection. Traffic circles may have Stop signs or signals.
- ◆ Roundabouts use deflection to slow entering traffic and enhance safety

Studies show roundabouts provide a:

- ◆ 90% reduction in fatal crashes
- ◆ 76% reduction in injury crashes
- ◆ 30-40% reduction in pedestrian crashes
- ◆ 10% reduction in bicycle crashes

Before a roundabout is selected for an intersection, a thorough analysis is completed and compared to other alternatives to determine the appropriate solution.

Environmentally Superior

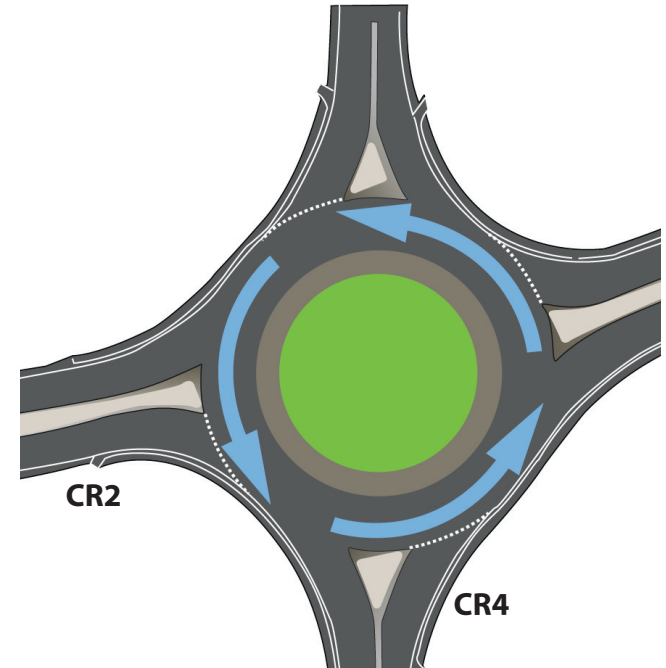
The reduced stopping, idling, accelerating and decelerating at roundabouts creates lower emissions than traffic signals.

FEATURES OF THE COUNTY ROAD 2 AND COUNTY ROAD 4 ROUNDABOUT



This sign indicates to drivers that a roundabout is ahead



This sign indicates the speed the driver should adhere to when approaching the roundabout



This guide sign indicates the destinations available at each exit



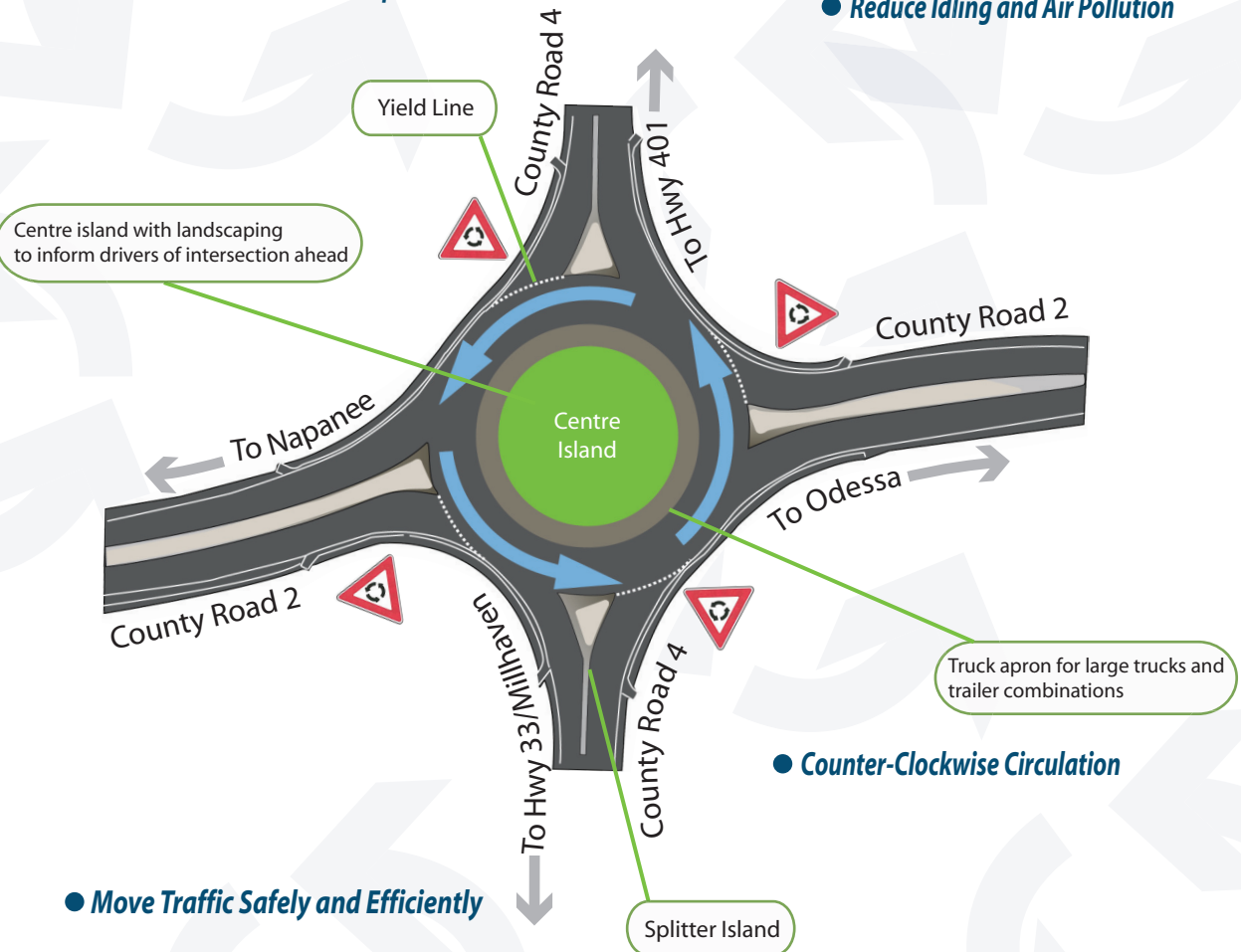
At the roundabout drivers must yield to all traffic in the roundabout



Keep right and drive counter clockwise around the island
