

Curbside Waste Collection

Garbage bags: One tag per bag, fastened as shown to the right. Maximum weight 40 lbs. per bag.

Garbage cans: Multiple kitchen bags can be placed in a container, to a maximum of 40 lbs. Fasten tag to top bag in container.



Wrap bag tag around neck of bag and stick ends together

Waste & recycling must be out before 7 a.m. on collection day.

Grey Box Recycling

All paper products should be placed in a clean, untied grocery bag. This helps keep the paper dry and from blowing away.

Accepted Items	Preparation	Do Not Include
Newspapers & Plastic Bags	Newspapers and all flyers Catalogues and magazines Plastic grocery bags, milk bags, pouches, frozen vegetable bags must be cleaned and placed into a bag that is tied shut	No cereal/cracker liner bags, plastic food wrap, and food storage bags No diaper, meat, bacon, pasta, pet food or bubble wrap packaging
Mixed Paper	Junk mail, office paper, telephone books, cards, paper bags, envelopes including window envelopes Soft and hard-cover books (remove and discard binding and hard covers) Shredded paper must be bagged with handles tied securely Paper beverage cups with a polycoat (plastic) lining (plastic lids go in blue box)	No gift wrap No photographs No used tissues or paper towels, or any other contaminated paper No paper beverage cups with a waxy liner
Boxboard and Polycoat	Boxes for cereal, crackers, pasta, etc.; shoe boxes, paper towel center cores, etc. Milk and juice cartons and tetra-pak containers must be rinsed Paper egg cartons	Remove plastic windows from pasta & tissue boxes Remove and discard inside bags and liners
Corrugated Cardboard	Boxes must be flattened. Tie in bundles, maximum size 36" x 24" x 8". Place no more than six bundles beside grey box Remove all food residue and contents from pizza boxes	Remove staples and tape No cardboard that has been contaminated with oil or chemicals No wax-coated boxes or soiled pizza boxes

Blue Box Recycling

Do not bag blue box items – place them loosely inside the blue box.

Accepted Items	Preparation	Do Not Include
Glass Bottles and Jars	Food and beverage glass bottles and jars of clear or coloured glass, rinsed (metal or plastic lids also go in blue box)	No light bulbs No window or mirror glass No drinking glasses, ceramics (plates, mugs, Pyrex, etc.) No broken glass of any kind
Plastics and Styrofoams No plastic bags. They belong in the Grey Box.	Plastic bottles, jars, tubs and lids with recycling symbol (all numbers). Empty and rinse all containers. White Styrofoam pieces no larger than 36" x 24" x 8"	No pails over 10L, laundry baskets, storage totes, toys, plastic cutlery No popcorn Styrofoam No coloured Styrofoam (such as meat trays) No large plastics that are not a food, beverage or household container
Aluminum and Steel Cans	All food and beverage cans and lids Clean aluminum containers Empty and rinse cans, placing lids inside and pinching can shut – no need to remove labels	No aerosol or paint cans No cooking pots or pans No foil wrap, paper-backed foil (takeout lids), or foil laminates (chip bags)

Household Hazardous Waste

Loyalist Township does not have a facility to dispose of Household Hazardous Waste. Loyalist Township residents may visit the HHW Depot at Kingston Area Recycling Centre, 196 Lappan's Lane, Kingston. There is no charge to Loyalist residents for this. Proof of residency may be required. The depot is open Thursdays and Saturdays, April through November.

Accepted: Adhesives, aerosol containers, antifreeze, batteries (all kinds), compact fluorescent lights and tubes, fire extinguishers, fuels, household cleaners, mercury devices (switches, thermometers and thermostats), oil, paint, propane cylinders, solvents.

Not accepted: Asbestos, incandescent lightbulbs, pharmaceuticals, sharps (needles), smoke alarms.

Electronics "E-waste" Disposal

Electronic waste is accepted at the waste disposal sites in Violet and on Amherst Island, and will be periodically transferred by a registered transporter to recyclers and end-use processors. There is no charge to Loyalist Township residents to dispose of e-waste at our landfill sites.

Accepted: Floor standing printing devices such as printers, photocopiers, multi-function devices; scanners; typewriters; telephones and answering machines; cellular phones and pagers; PDAs; tablets; audio and video players and recorders; cameras (web, digital, analogue); equalizers; preamplifiers; radios; receivers; speakers; turntables; video players/projectors; digital frames; video recorders; personal hand-held computers; desktop computers; laptop computers; computer accessories; monitors; televisions; desktop printers.

Free Large Item Disposal Opportunities (FLIDO)

Loyalist Township has a program to allow Township residents to dispose of large items at our landfills at no charge. Free Large Item Disposal Opportunities, or FLIDO, may be used any time the landfills are open.

One FLIDO is considered to be the equivalent of one pickup truck load, approximately 2.44 metres (8 feet) by 1.22 metres (4 feet) by 0.6 metres (2 feet) = 1.78 cubic metres (64 cubic feet). Each household has two FLIDO per year.

What is a Large Item? Items that are not hazardous, reusable, or recyclable, such as:

- Couches, chairs, tables, mattresses
- Tents
- Home office furniture
- Carpet and vinyl flooring
- Bathroom toilets and sinks
- Steel bathtubs
- Scrap steel (bicycle frames, steel doors, aluminum window frames, aluminum wall siding, brass fittings, copper pipe)
- Electronic waste (such as cell phones, computers, printers, T.V.'s, stereo receivers)
- Refrigerators, freezers, dish washers, ovens, washing machines, dryers, air conditioners

How Can You Use a FLIDO? Make sure that you have documentation with you that proves you are a resident of Loyalist Township (Photo ID, tax bill). Bring your large items to the landfill during the hours of operation. Check in with the landfill attendant and let them know that you are using a FLIDO. The landfill attendant will ask you for proof of residency. The landfill attendant will check the items to ensure that they are acceptable for disposal. Upon approval of the items the attendant will ask you to proceed to the scale. When the visit is complete, they will deduct one FLIDO from your account.

If someone is delivering "Large Items" on your behalf, a request must be registered in advance to obtain a required "approval number". This may be done either in person at the Loyalist Township Office, or by telephone at ext. 116.

If you have used all your opportunities for the year, regular disposal fees will apply. The current tipping fee is \$125/tonne, with a \$15 minimum charge per visit. Household garbage does not qualify for FLIDO. Household garbage that has not been bagged **and** tagged will be subject to tipping fees as mentioned above. No payment is required if bag tags have been placed on each garbage bag.
